May 18, 2014 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (A) Acts 6:1–7 / 1 Pt 2:4–9 / Jn 14:1–12

When the planes flew into New York's twin towers on that fateful Tuesday in September 2001, I had just arrived early to set up for a meeting of campus ministers. I had caught the first account on the car radio. "Are you listening to this?" I asked a colleague. She hadn't heard the news, but my boss came down from his apartment upstairs and said quietly, "I have it on TV." I couldn't think of anything to say except, "Show it to me; can I see it?"

We went upstairs and watched as long as we could before our colleagues arrived, and we talked and listened and then went into Mass to pray for the lives lost and for the future of our world.

"Show me," we say, when things seems impossible to imagine. "Show me," we say when a child comes in wideeyed wonder with a treasure she has just found. "Show me," Philip said, because he couldn't imagine the God-Father that Jesus was speaking about. He expected some grand sign—an earthquake, a thunderstorm, or any of the ways the presence of God was depicted in the Old Testament.

What he did not expect was that Jesus, who was standing right in front of him, was God himself: "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."


We often miss the evidence that God is with us. It may be something as simple as the beauty of creation or the outpouring of love and support the world gave to the people of New York that long-ago day.
